Global Impact Scholarship

In an effort to promote diversity on campus and encourage more overseas applicants and applicants from Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan to apply to the MBA/Master of Finance program, SAIF has set up the Global Impact Scholarship (GIS) which is a merit-based award in the form of tuition waiver.

MBA Continuing Scholarship

The scholarship is granted in the second academic year for MBA students who have distinguished themselves in academic performance and/or contribution to the class and SAIF in the first academic year.

- * Student Service Fellowship RMB 10,000

MBA High GMAT Score Scholarship

The RMB 10,000 worth scholarship is provided to MBA candidates, including part-time MBA candidates, who achieve high scores in GMAT. The high score will be decided each year due to varied candidate pools.

Government / University Scholarships

A wide range of scholarship are also offered by the Chinese Government and Shanghai Jiao Tong University(SJTU) to international students who pursue their studies at SJTU.
